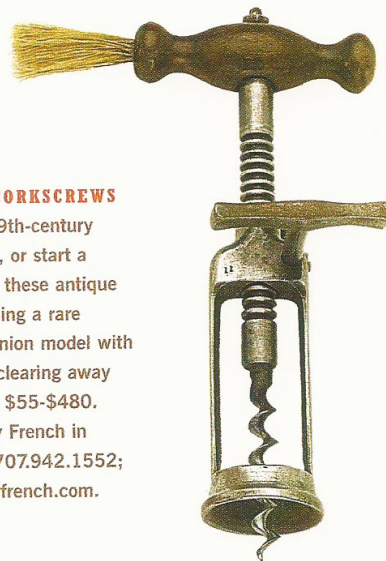
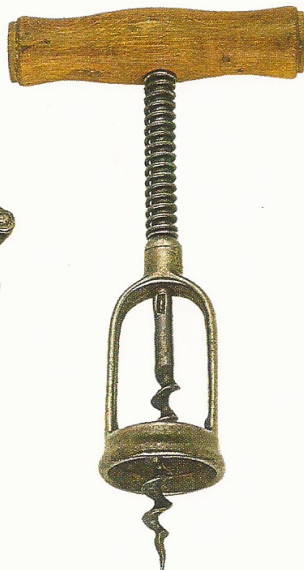
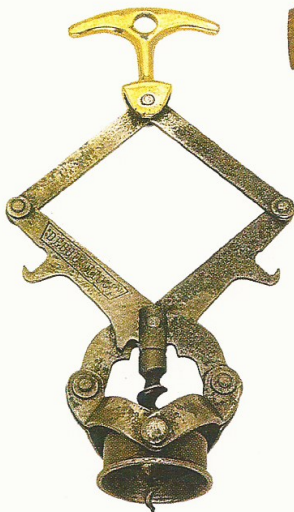
Harvest picks
